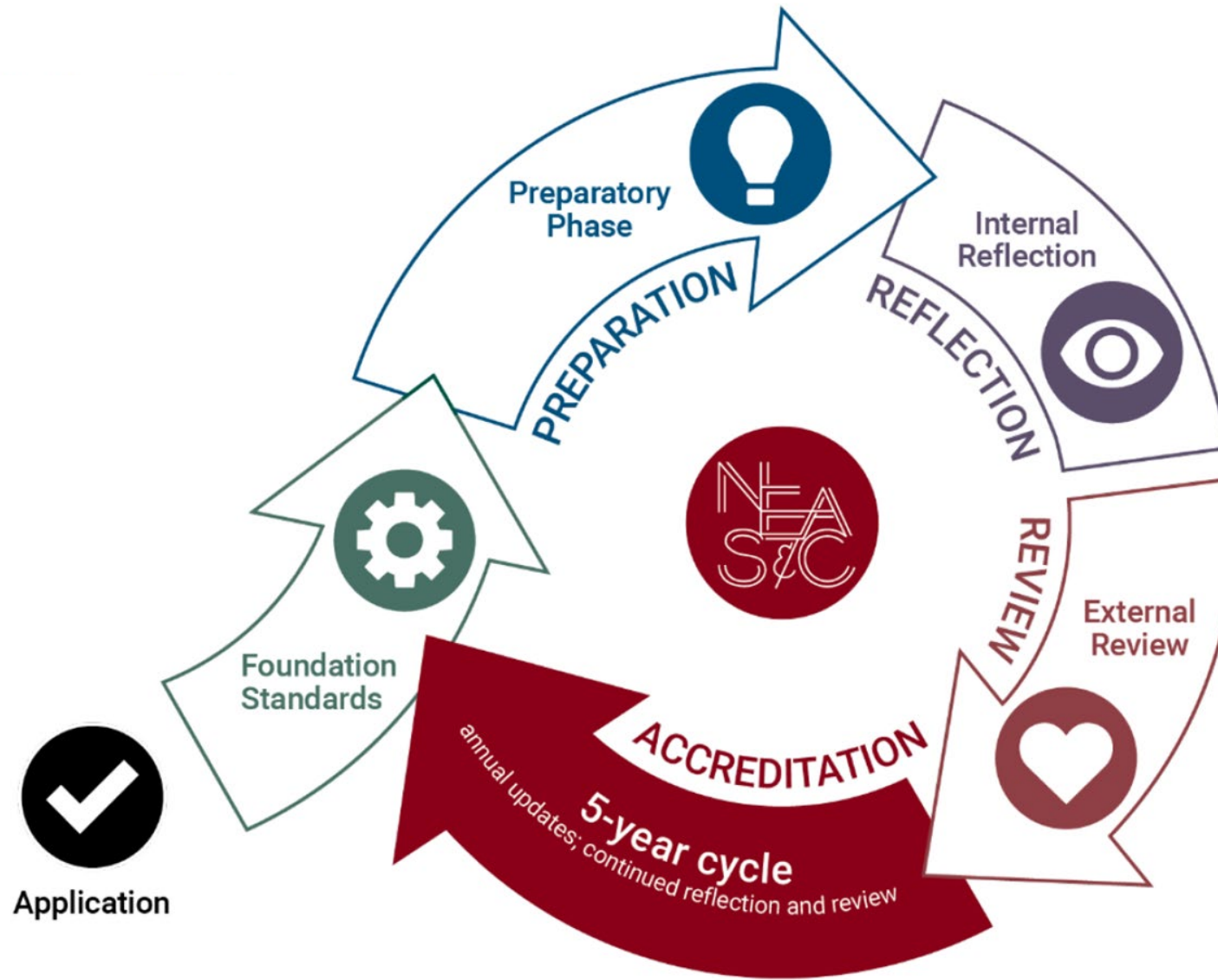
Launched in 2016, ACE Learning allows schools to earn NEASC Accreditation while focusing on effective learning and teaching in a modern world.

PRIMARY (ages 6-10)

2. **Family and Community Connections:** Emphasizes learning about African heritage, working together under Ubuntu values, and environmental stewardship.
3. **Exploring Our World:** Introduces students to local geography, media, and basic global understanding, fostering a sense of curiosity and connection.
4. **Growing as Global Citizens:** Lessons on African and global geography and discussions on technology use and future global issues.

SECONDARY (ages 11-18)

1. **Self Discovery & Growth:** Focuses on physical education, career exploration, health, language, data, and AI literacy, encouraging personal development. Integrate entrepreneurship by including business basics, market research, and the importance of innovation and ethics.
2. **Family & Community Dynamics:** Develops social skills, explores African history, emphasizes Ubuntu, and engages in artistic and technological projects within the community.
3. **Rural & Urban Harmony & Development:** Covers urban sustainability, media discernment, city planning, and the use of AI in urban contexts.
4. **National Identity & Responsibility:** In-depth study of national history, unity, governance, environmental policies, and economics.
5. **Continental Unity & Diplomacy:** Engages in discussions on continental issues, economic analysis, and celebrates African art and trade.
6. **Global Citizenship & Harmony:** Enhances understanding of global news, technology for global challenges, and promotes global empathy and financial literacy.
